FIVE FACTS ABOUT SCHOOL

ATTENDANCE

Over 8 million U.S. students miss nearly a month of school each year.

Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.

By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.

Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade or be held back.

Absenteeism and its ill effects start early. One in 10 kindergarten and first grade students are chronically absent.
